School and Preschool have been a hive of activity already this term, with so much amazing learning happening – as you will see in the following pages!

Our Year 3/4 class have begun a Learning Expedition on Bees – and the excitement and engagement that I see whenever I walk through their classroom is truly beautiful to see. Learning Expeditions are learning experiences that combine purposeful, beautiful work so that our children and young people develop their skills as effective learners and positive contributors to their communities. Learning Expeditions utilise experts, so that students learn deeply about their topics, as well as field work that they can see where their learning fits into the world around them. When you're next on site, please take a walk through the Year 3/4 classroom, or ask one of the students about bees – you'll see what I mean about exciting!!

This term our Preschool and Reception children have returned to Scrub School. This is another learning experience that is unique to Beachport, and is such a special way of learning for our kids. At Scrub School, our children explore, problem solve, learn to take risks, collaborate and communicate – all in the beautiful environment that is right at our door step. Our educators do a wonderful job scaffolding and supporting such powerful and meaningful learning experiences – something I am truly proud of here at Beachport.

These are only two examples of the exciting and meaningful ways that we are developing Effective Learners – young people with the skills and dispositions to contribute positively to their community and world. As a staff, we have been discussing so many ideas for possible Learning Expeditions – involving and contributing to the Beachport Community is important to our school and preschool. Busy Bees

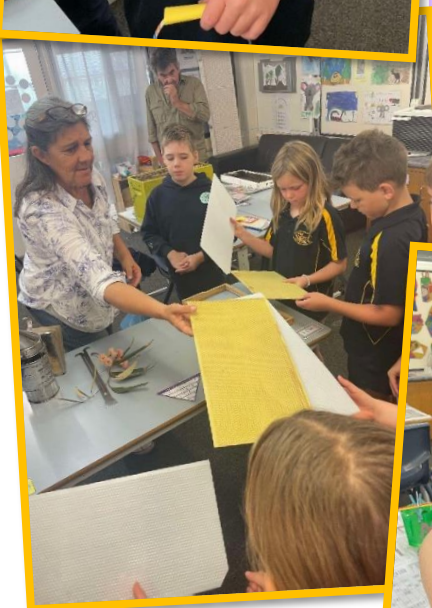


Middle primary students have been busy bees this Term as they begin their Learning Expedition on our question 'How can we bring awareness to the importance of bees in a sustainable future?'

Students began their learning by making bees wax candles for Mother's Day. Students had to break the bees wax into pieces, melt the wax, strain out impurities and pour it into their candle jars. Students have learnt about the lifecycle of bees and how bees and other pollinators spread pollen and collect nectar.

We had a visit from our local bee expert Tony McAllister who showed us some frames he uses in his bee hives. Students were able to see how the honey is placed into the honeycomb and then covered in bees wax to protect and store it.

This Term, the class will continue their work on spreading the importance of bees in our world and will celebrate World Bee Day on Wednesday, Week 4 by baking some yummy honey based goodies to sell at our school.
